




Brief Introduction and History of Bharatpur Eye Hospital

Bharatpur Eye Hospital; BEH (Hiralal Santudevi Pradhan Institute of Ophthalmic Sciences) is located in the Chitwan District of southern central Nepal. BEH is a non-profit making, charitable organization under the umbrella of Nepal Netra Jyoti Sangh (NNJS). Its objective is to provide high-quality comprehensive eye care services at an affordable cost to local as well as patients from neighboring districts like Gorkha, Lamjung, Nawalpur, Tanahau, Makwanpur, Parsa & Dhading which comprises of about two million populations. In addition to Base Hospital located at Bharatpur Metro Municipality, BEH has established 3 secondary level eye hospitals and 10 eye care centers at different places in its catchment area.

Bharatpur Eye Hospital was established in 1987. The hospital building was constructed with financial and technical support from the Bank of Commerce and Credits International (BCCI) Foundation Pakistan. The hospital was inaugurated jointly by the Late King Birendra Bir Bikram Shah Dev and the President of Pakistan, Ghulam Ishaq Khan on 31 March 1988. This was the only one eye hospital named after king, which was changed after Nepal attained Republic in 2008. BEH has an academic wing known as Hiralal Santudevi Pradhan Institute of Ophthalmic Sciences and is conducting residency in ophthalmology and fellowship programs in vitreo-retina and SICS in affiliation with the National Academy of Medical Sciences (NAMS). Similarly, it is conducting academic programs like Bachelor in Optometry (B Optom) under NAMS and Certificate Level in Ophthalmic Science under CTEVT Program.



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
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Performance of 2021-22






EYE SURGERIES 2021-22




Pediatric Service

A total of **12,028** pediatric patients aged 0-16 years were examined in pediatric department in the year 2021-22. This is the increase in 25 % compared to previous year. **6,676 (55.5%)** were Male children and **5,216(45.5%)** were Female children. A total of 90 pediatric surgeries were performed in the year 2021-2022.



Vitero-Retina Service

In the year 2021-22, a total of **4,326** patients were treated in the vitreo-retina department. This is an increase of 38 % compared to the previous year. This year **307** patient underwent Vitero- retinal surgeries. **352** patients were given different types of LASER treatment. **331** patients were given AVASTIN injection for retinal disease.





Cornea Department

A total of **2,528** patients with corneal disease were treated. **381** cornea related surgeries were performed. **114** patients were given sight through corneal transplantation and **39** corneal tissue of **20** people were collected since the establishment of transplant service and cornea collection centre.


A total of **3,225** patients' visit was recorded in Oculoplastic department out of which 387 different oculoplastic related surgical procedure were performed.

Glaucoma Department

- Total Glaucoma patient treated 3,663
- 52% (1850) patients were females
- 86 patients underwent glaucoma surgeries; out of which 36 patients underwent Phaco-trab and 50 underwent Trabeculectomy
- YAG PI was done in 137 patients



Low vision and contact lens department

BEH is providing low vision and contact lens service to the patients through this clinic. The low vision clinic has most of the devices needed for low vision service. It has all range of devices like optical, non-optical and electronic devices. Optometrist, Optometry students and ophthalmic science students have opportunity to get exposure in dealing with low vision and contact lens patients. A total of 34 patients visited low vision clinic and 7 of them benefited through the optical devices and the rest were done counselling and advised for non-optical devices and environment modification. Contact lenses were dispensed to 15 patients and majority of the contact lenses prescribed were soft lenses.



Tele-Ophthalmology

Bharatpur Eye Hospital started a telemedicine service with the aim to provide door-to-door appropriate eye care services to patients in communities. Each eye care center is connected to the base hospital. Ophthalmic assistants at ECCs do a regular tele consultation whenever they need a second opinion from Ophthalmologist at base hospital.



Eye care centers (ECC)


27,374 patients were served and **897** patients were referred to base hospital for cataract surgery through its 11 eye care centers.

Trainings, Seminars And Workshops

Academic training programs

Bharatpur Eye Hospital as Hiralal Santudevi Pradhan Eye Institute is running academic and training programs with the affiliation from National Academy of Medical Sciences (NAMS) and CTEVT and produce different level of eye care human resources to meet the need of eye care service in the country.

Short term trainings conducted in 2021-22

Outreach Coordinator Training

Bharatpur Eye hospital successfully conducted a 3 weeks Outreach Program Coordinator's Training with financial support from SEVA foundation. It is the first training of such type being conducted in Nepal. There were 14 participants from different eye hospitals in Nepal, including the participants from Tilganga Institute of Ophthalmology. Training sessions were led by different experts working at different hospitals or organizations.





CME on Retinopathy of prematurity (ROP)

One day seminar with the theme "Retinopathy of Prematurity: A burning issue" was conducted on June 11 2022. Eye care professionals and Pediatricians around Chitwan took part in the CME.





Ophthalmic Assistant training on corneal care

A pilot training on Cornea clinical care for ophthalmic assistants was conducted on 6-7 June which was supported by SightLife.



Refraction training was successfully completed in 2 batches. Optometrists and Ophthalmic assistants from Bharatpur Eye Hospital networks and other Eye Hospitals participated in the training.



Training on RGP and scleral contact lens- One day workshop on RGP and Scleral contact lens fitting was completed with the active participation of optometry students and faculties.



Successfully conducted **Basic Life Support (BLS) training** for Health Care Providers.



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Research And Publications

Research

Village Integrated Eye Workers Trial (VIEW) – This research project started in 2014 in collaboration with University of California San Francisco, Proctor Foundation, SEVA foundation and Bharatpur Eye Hospital. The aim of the study was to find the effectiveness of Female Community Volunteers (FCHVs) in preventing corneal blindness due to trauma. This was a three years study which ended in 2017 with the result that FCHVs intervention was effective in reducing corneal opacities due to ocular trauma in the rural communities than peri- urban or urban communities. Latter since September 2017 SightLife took this research as a corneal prevention program, where trained FCHVs are detecting and treating corneal abrasion due to trauma with prophylactic antibiotic ointment in their communities and appropriate referrals to eye care centers or eye hospitals.

Second Phase of the VIEW called VIEW II – Pilot was launched on 2018 to determine the most effective methods of community screening. This is the cluster randomized trial aims to determine whether community based screening program is more effective than cataract camp approach, in detecting more cases of glaucoma, DR and ARM and also to determine whether community health volunteer program increases the rate of cataract surgery compared to no program. The community based screening included fundus photography, auto refraction, IOP measurement of individuals 50 years and above.

After VIEW II Pilot a real VIEW II study started in 2019 and is undergoing in full phase. This is cluster randomized trial to identify if an intensive screening with OCT and linkage to care can reduce the number of blindness due to Glaucoma, DR and ARMD compared to no intervention area in individuals 60 years and above. The final census will be done to find the cause of blindness in the community.

Operational Research Capacity Building (ORCB)

This is a research project being conducted at Bharatpur Eye Hospital, collaborating with Indian Institute of Public Health (IIPH), Hyderabad, India and Seva. There are four Eye Hospitals 3 from Nepal and 1 from India involved in the project. BEH is currently working on the topic "Improving the follow up



rates of pediatric patients (0-16) years attending Bharatpur Eye Hospital a: Public Health Intervention Study". We were able to publish the Protocal of the research in JMIR Research Protocals which is an international Journal.

Publications




